



## Second Workshop of the Brazilian Institute for Web Science Research

The Second Workshop of the Brazilian Institute for Web Science Research will bring together the project participants to present their work in the five project areas, discuss about their ongoing activities and foster further collaboration. The workshop will take place on **02-03 Aug 2011**, at **PUC-Rio**, in the **American Express Auditorium**.

## **Second Call for Participation**

The workshop program will consist of three keynote talks, one panel, one tutorial, invited paper presentations, and prototype demonstrations.

Both full papers and position papers can be presented at the workshop. They must be presented in English, in 10 minutes each. At the end of each session, there will be a discussion on the session topic and the papers presented.

We assume that full papers are already published or submitted work, provided that the date of their publication or submission does not precede our First Workshop (August 2010). They will be available to project members in a private area in the wiki, and the printed workshop program will

include their abstracts. Position papers should describe ongoing work, must not exceed 4000 words, and must follow in the standard SBC publication format, available for download at: http://www.sbc.org.br/index.php?language=1&content=downloads&id=286

The presentations will be selected by the program committee (composed of the steering and organization committees) from among the publications registered in the project wiki (<a href="http://webscience.org.br/wiki">http://webscience.org.br/wiki</a>). The criteria for selecting a paper for presentation are: coverage of the project areas and topics, and relevance of contribution to the project. Priority will be given to papers by co-authors from different participating institutions.

In order to prepare the sessions in advance, we ask participants to **register the title of their position papers** no later than **2 May 2011**. The paper itself must be **uploaded** no later than **3 Jun 2011** to be considered for presentation at the workshop. When registering a paper, you must explicitly relate it to the corresponding project goal and provide a 30-word statement of contribution to that goal. Instructions for registering and uploading the publications may be found in the **New Publications** page in the wiki.

In this edition of the workshop, we are organizing a **demo session**. Please register your prototypes and demos no later than **3 Jun 2011** in the <u>Prototypes and Other Deliverables</u> page in the wiki.

There will also be four 30-minute slots for discussions targeting specific collaboration opportunities. The themes for these discussions should be suggested in the wiki, identifying each discussion's proponent, who will be responsible for organizing and moderating the session. The project members can then declare in the wiki their interest in the discussions in which they would like to participate.
